The appointee will be responsible for running projects on language processing. Specific duties include conducting literature review, preparation of experimental materials, programming experiments, data collection, data analysis, drafting research reports. He/she is also expected to perform administrative support to the Principal Investigator. The appointment will be for a period of around 4 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology or a related discipline. He/she should have high proficiency in both English and Chinese (preferably in both Mandarin and Cantonese), and competency in academic writing. Experience with psycholinguistics research especially using the eye tracker (the eyelink system, SR research), and being able to use relevant softwares (e.g., MPlus, R, Matlab) to perform data analysis will be of advantage.
