The appointee will be required to work on weekdays and weekend (if necessary). The appointment will be of 6 months, while renewal of contract will be based on mutual agreement.

Applicants should be proficient in both qualitative and quantitative research methods, and in both English and Chinese. Preference will be given to applicants who is knowledgeable and experienced in Chinese xiqu.
