The Department of Curriculum and Instruction is seeking qualified and highly dedicated researchers to provide research support to an RGC Senior Research Fellow Scheme project entitled “Bottom-up Assessment Reform: The Student-centred Assessment-driven Learning (SCADL) Platform”. This project aims to develop an online adaptive learning system for secondary school mathematics. The appointee will assist in duties such as platform development (e.g., Human-computer interaction design, Design-based Research, Computational Design) and/or conducting educational research (e.g., literature review, data collection and analysis, report and journal drafting), and any other duties as assigned. The initial appointment period will be 12 months and may be extended upon mutual agreement.

For the post of Senior Research Assistant, applicants should have a Master’s Degree in Educational Technology, Computer Science, Education Measurement, Educational Assessment, or other related disciplines plus one year’s post-master full-time working experience, or a doctorate.

For the post of Research Assistant I, applicants should have a Bachelor’s or Master’s Degree in related disciplines.

Applicants should be adept at multi-tasking, working under tight schedules, and be able to work both independently and as a team. They should also have an excellent command of written English, especially in academic writing. Knowledge and experience in research or development of online learning platforms will be an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
